VOTER ELIGIBILITY AND REGISTRATION

You are qualified to vote if:

- ☆ You are a citizen of the United States.
- ☆ At least 18 years old by Election Day.
- ☆ You have been a resident of Michigan at least 30 days prior to an Election.
- ☆ You have registered on or before the close of registration preceding the Election.

Where can I register?

- ☆ At your City, County or Township Clerk's Office.
- ☆ At any Secretary of State branch office.
- ☆ By mail-in registration.* Applications can be downloaded from the City's website.
- ☆ At the specified agency for clients of the Family Independence Agency, Department of Community Health and the Committee for the Blind.

*If you register by mail and have never voted in Michigan, you must vote in person for your first Election. This does not apply to people who are 60 years of age or older, disabled persons, or military or overseas citizens.

CLOSE OF REGISTRATION

Deadlines:

- ☆ Presidential Election, registration deadline is October 11.

VOTING PROCEDURES

Photo I.D. or signed affidavit required at the Polls:

When you arrive at your polling place to vote, State law requires you to either show picture ID or sign an affidavit attesting that you are not in possession of current picture ID. You can satisfy the ID requirement by showing one of the following:

- ☆ Driver's License or Personal I.D. Card (Michigan or other state)
- ☆ Federal or State government issued photo I.D.

- ☆ U.S. Passport
- ☆ Military I.D. card with photo
- ☆ Student I.D. card with photo (high school or accredited institution of higher education)
- ☆ Tribal I.D. card with photo

Voters Who Require Assistance:

- ☆ Special accommodations are available for voters who are disabled.
- ☆ If you require voting assistance, ask the election workers for help; a reason for the needed assistance does not have to be stated. Two inspectors will assist you in the voting station.
- ☆ An elector who is blind, disabled, or unable to read or write may be assisted with his or her ballot by any person of the voter's choice, other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer, or an officer or agent of a union to which the voter belongs.

ABSENTEE VOTING

You may vote by Absentee Ballot if you:

- ☆ Are 60 years of age or older.
- ☆ Expect to be absent from your community for the entire time the polls are open on Election Day.
- ☆ Are physically unable to attend the polls without assistance of another.
- ☆ Cannot attend the polls because of the tenets of your religion.
- ☆ Have been appointed an election inspector in a precinct other than the precinct in which you reside.
- ☆ Are confined to jail awaiting arraignment or trial.

How do I apply for an Absent Voter Ballot?

- ☆ By contacting the City Clerk's Office by phone or mail.
- ☆ In person at the City Clerk's Office.

- ☆ Download an application from the City's website and mail it to the City Clerk's Office.

What is the deadline for applying for Absent Voter Ballots?

- ☆ Application must be received by the Clerk's Office by 2pm on the Saturday preceding the Election.
- ☆ You may also appear in person at your local Clerk's Office the Monday prior to an Election up until 4pm. The ballot must be voted at that time, and you will not be allowed to leave with your ballot on this day.

How can I automatically receive applications for Absent Voter Ballots?

- ☆ If you wish to be placed on our permanent list to automatically receive an application for absent voter ballot for all future Elections, you can contact the City Clerk's Office at 248.871-2416 or email permlist@fhgov.com and provide your name, registered address and phone number. The application will be mailed to you prior to every Election.

What is the process for returning an Absentee Ballot?

- ☆ You can mail your ballot in or bring it back in person to the City Clerk's Office.
- ☆ Absentee Ballots must be received by 8:00p.m. on Election Day.
- ☆ Post marks are not accepted and late ballots will not be counted.

Farmington Hills Voters:

A drop box for election material (absent voter applications and ballots) is located on the south entrance wall to City Hall and a drive-up drop box is located in front of the Police Department near the U.S. Postal mail boxes
